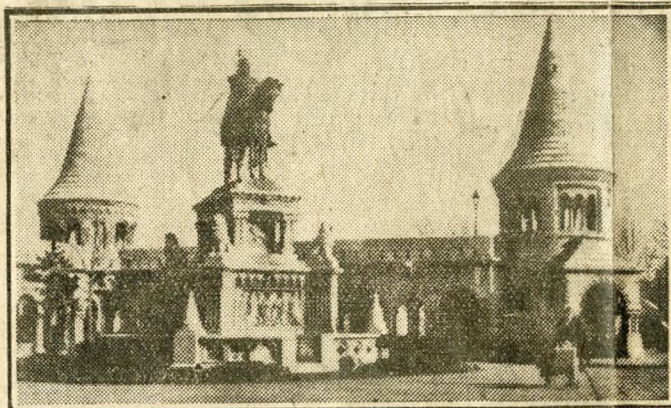

STAGE STANDARD HIGH IN BUDAPEST

The theater in Budapest is one of the greatest attractions in this city of great attractions.

The standard of the performances at Hungarian theatres is equal to that of any of the large western cities in Europe or America, the best proof of this is the great success of Hungarian playwrights in Vienna, Berlin, Rome, London and New York.

The Hungarian public is very difficult to please and often even too particular. The most artful advertising cannot make a play a success if it does not come up to the desired standard, whereas if a play is unanimously approved of by the public, it will stand its ground in any other country. However, foreign tourists, not knowing the language, cannot appreciate our dramatic stage, with the exception of some characteristic Hungarian musical plays with an exotic flavour and novelty of national costumes.

But the National Theatre, where a great variety of national Hungarian and international classical comedies and dramas are played, affords an ample opportunity to the foreigner to compare the Hungarian performance of a well-known classical play with that seen with the best at home.

Operas and operettes can be seen in four or five theatres and, of course, in the Opera House, which is on the Andrássy-ut, one of the most beautiful avenues in the world. There is no lack of foreign artists either, as almost every world famous actor and singer includes Budapest in his or her world tour.

There is also a great choice of motion picture theaters of all sizes, with accommodations for audiences of 300 to 1000 people, and some of them are lavishly equipped with first-class symphony orchestras.

"Hungarian Sea" Attracts Sailors From Budapest

A very interesting specialty of the country around Budapest is the Lake of Balaton, called the Hungarian Sea.

That is no exaggeration, because this lake of an extension of not less than 120 kilometers has such special qualities which you cannot find in any other lake. The waves are sometimes like that of a sea, the water has a mild temperature (26 degrees) and the volcano-geologic formation of this part of the country contributes very much to make of it a most enjoyable sporting place for sailing.

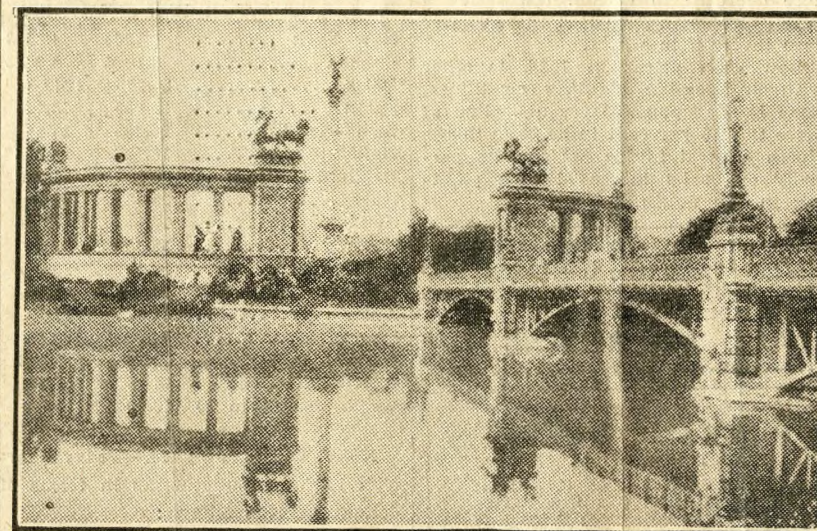
On both shores of the lake, there are about 20 watering places, among which "Balaton Füred", open summer and winter, is the mecca for persons suffering from heart-disease.
