## Famous Danube Trip To Budapest Is Tourists' Thrill In A Lifetime

### Modern River Boats Make Voyage Delightful

BUDAPEST, Sept. 13.—The famous trip up the River Danube to Budapest, besides its beauty, is of importance chiefly from the point of view of international traffic. Those foreigners coming from the West on a visit to Hungary and more particularly to the lovely capital of that country, on their arrival

in Vienna find a special pleasure on embarking on one of the passenger steamers of the Hungarian River and Sea Navigation Company.

It is possible to sleep on board over night. The journey lasts from early morning till sunset and is most enjoyable and refreshing after a long railway journey, and serves to calm and soothe the nerves. Passengers arrive in the very heart of Budapest, so close to all the principal hotels that no conveyance is required.

The airy and comfortable two and four berth cabins are under the management of the International Sleeping Car Company and are most restful; while there is a bath room on every steamer.

In windy weather passengers have at their disposal a spacious saloon affording complete protection, comfortably furnished in the style of the best clubs; a dining room of imposing dimensions; and on the deck a smoking room and a ladies' saloon, all affording passengers an uninterrupted view of the scenery.
