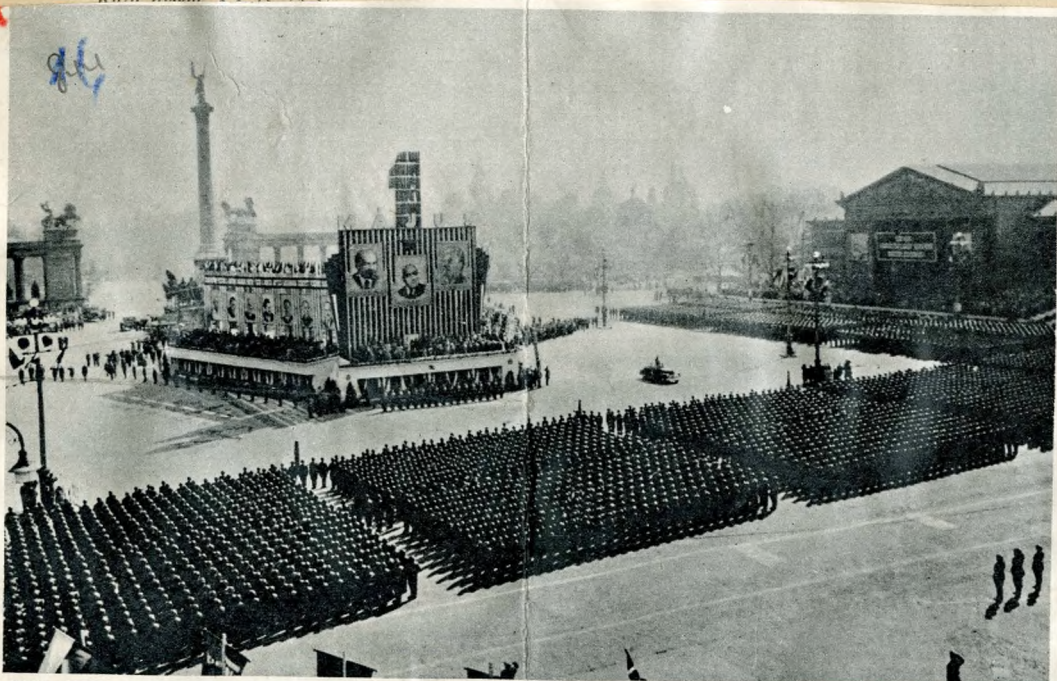

HUNGARY'S MAY DAY WAS STRONGLY MILITARY IN TONE: Units of the Hungarian Army parading on the Square of Heroes in front of a rostrum bearing portraits of Lenin, Stalin and the Hungarian leaders. As in Moscow, there was a civilian procession after the military parade, and in this procession, lasting several hours and including hundreds of thousands of people, there were floats bearing caricatures of President Truman, Winston Churchill and Marshal Tito. A reporter who was on the spot, declared that the keynote of the speeches was, "We celebrate to-day, but we must stay strong, for the imperialists are on our southern border."
