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## CHARM OF BUDAPEST.

### A CORDIAL WELCOME FOR ENGLISH VISITORS.

The city of Budapest has done right to draw the attention of English people to its charms and advantages in an advertisement which appears in to-day's *Daily Mail*, for undoubtedly it is one of the most fascinating cities of Europe, both in its situation on the banks of the Danube and in the enjoyments which it offers to the traveller.

The forests which surround Budapest are celebrated for their beauty, and in the vicinity are many health resorts. Those who have been there return again and again, and it is no exaggeration to say that the capital city of Hungary is one of the most enchanting cities in the world.
