BUDAPEST CAFE BATTLE.

MANY CASUALTIES FROM RANDOM FIRING.

FROM OUR SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT.

VIENNA, Sunday.

Sanguinary rioting took place yesterday at Budapest, in which 5 soldiers were killed and many people severely injured. About 11 o'clock soldiers of the Red Guard entered a café and demanded to be provided with drink. The sale of drink now being prohibited in Budapest, they were refused. Thereupon one of the soldiers extinguished the lights of the café, and the 300 people present made a wild stampede for the door.

Shots were fired, the People's Guard intervened, and general firing ensued. Most of the casualties were caused by shots from the barracks opposite the café.

At 2 o'clock yesterday the Communist Party held a meeting in front of the town hall in Vienna in token of sympathy for the deaths of Liebknecht and Rosa Luxemburg. Soldiers paraded the streets with red banners, on which was inscribed, "Let us mourn for the martyrs of Berlin!" Inflammatory speeches were made, but special measures having been taken to keep order, there was no disturbance.

Last night the band of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment gave a concert in Ronacher Music Hall here in aid of the poor children of the city. The band had an enthusiastic reception from a crowded audience, which loudly cheered each selection.
