FRENCH IN BUDAPEST.

MACKENSEN A PRISONER.

AMSTERDAM, Jan. 1.

A Budapest telegram says:

About 2,000 French troops arrived here yesterday morning and were quartered at Rakos Palota. At about eight o'clock, according to the newspapers, a detachment of about eight hundred French troops marched out and surrounded the castle of Count Ladislaus Karolyi, where Field-Marshal von Mackensen is quartered. When Marshal von Mackensen learned of the French design he protested, because he had placed himself at the disposal of the Hungarian Government. The French Commander took no cognisance of the protest, but went to Marshal von Mackensen and informed him that, according to orders, he must occupy the castle and intern the Field-Marshal. The latter again protested, but the protest was disregarded by the French officer, who gave his men their orders. Field-Marshal von Mackensen thereupon applied to Count Karolyi for protection and satisfaction. Count Karolyi immediately called on the Minister of War to deliberate with him regarding the action which the Government should take.—*Reuter.*
